








### President's Letter

### What is the Run Walk Wag?

The Run Walk Wag is one of the shelter's largest fundraiser. It features a 5K and 10K road race on the beautiful back roads of North Brookfield, as well as a family friendly 2 mile walk with (or without) your dog at the start of the fall season. The event is held at Second Chance's Pet Wellness and Education Center, where the shelter helps to fix over 5,000 pets a year. This is the third year the event will be held at this facility, which the shelter opened in 2010. The shelter also operates an Adoption Center in East Brookfield (since 1999).

Participants come to this event to spend time with the family, dogs, and friends. You can run in the fun 5K or 10K course, both of which are professionally timed, or walk in the leisurely 2 mile walk (with or without your dog). In addition, you can enjoy K9 demos, vendors with exciting products for the runner and/or animal lover. **Many participants "wag a little harder" by raising pledges to support the shelter.** Second Chance is a leader in Central Massachusetts by helping nearly 10,000 pets a year through adoption, spay/neuter, wellness clinics, training, a pet food pantry, and more!

All proceeds from the Run Walk Wag benefit the shelter's many programs. We are asking you to support this event in 2013, helping the shelter to provide these needed services to help pets, and people, and to enhance the human/animal bond.

### Home made odor neutralizer

Mix the following:

1 quart 3 percent hydrogen peroxide

1/4 cup baking soda

1 teaspoon liquid soap (laundry or dishwashing soap)

Apply to the animal, using care to avoid eyes and ears, and rinse after five minutes. Use outside for less mess.

A caution: Use the solution right away; it will not keep.

Lucy Lou came to us in very tough shape. She is a victim of this economy and the inability of her owners to care for her. Lucy Lou is a sweet 7 year old chocolate lab suffering from several treatable medical issues. She was infested with fleas and had flea dermatitis which had resulted in significant hair loss. She had severe ear infections with discharge, she had a urinary tract infection which caused her to have discomfort when she went to the bathroom and have blood in her urine. And that is just upon initial medical exam. She needed weeks of medical treatment, a foster home to give her a special bath every 3 days, and lots of love. Further tests needed to be done to see if there was more to her medical story. She had some discomfort in her abdominal and showed signs of having multiple litters of puppies.

Immediately upon intake into our shelter she received a bath and fast acting flea medication to get rid of the fleas and stop the discomfort from them. She was immediately examined by our wellness center and begun treatment for the initial issues found. More tests were done in the following days. She went into one of our wonderful foster homes soon after where she could be closely monitored.

After a week in our care she went to our wellness center for a check-up. Her skin was looking better, far less inflamed. She needed to come back in another two weeks but it already looked like the medications were working!



She was cared for 24/7 by our wonderful foster home, which includes several rounds of medication every day to help take care of her medical needs. We are so grateful for our foster homes for all they do for pets like this. Lucy Lou was in so much discomfort when she came to us, it was heart-warming to see her in loving hands and feeling better. It would be weeks before all of her medical treatment were done, her fur to grow back, and her ears to look more normal. But, she was on the road to recovery.

This is why we need YOU! Please help us raise the funds we need to help transform all the pets that come through our doors into happy pets in new loving homes!

## **So... what is it that Second Chance Animal Shelter does?**



When most folks hear the word “Shelter” they make the automatic assumption that the organization houses stray, abandoned and surrendered animals until such time as they can find a forever home for the pet. Well this is certainly true for Second Chance. We do exactly that!! But it goes far beyond just sheltering the animal.

The first thing that happens when a companion animal is brought to our shelter is a behavioral evaluation. Our trained and certified staff will test the animal for several be-

havior factors so as to insure the animal presents no threat to humans. Food aggression, toy guarding, handling and sociability and among a few of the traits tested. If the animal passes he/she is taken in to the shelter. From here we now begin the process of handling the animal to determine what the basic personality is so we can provide the potential owner with a dog or cat that will fit their specific needs.

The animal then will be scheduled to see our Vet team for a full medical exam, spay/neuter, microchipping, vaccines, and whatever other medical the pet may need. Once cleared by the staff, it is now available for adoption.

But this is only one segment of what Second Chance does. Let me give you a thumbnail sketch of just a few of the programs and services that go far beyond basic sheltering of the animals

- **Low cost vaccination clinics are held every Wed from 9-11AM at our Wellness Center. No appointment is necessary. We also do microchipping, testing for heart-worm/lyme, and other parasite issues.**
- **Second Chance reaches out to over 40 other shelter, rescues and Animal Control Facilities throughout the state. We provide them with transport service from pick up points, bringing animals to our Wellness Ctr. where they will undergo S/N surgery. They are returned at the end of day. We also assist them by taking in pets when they are full.**
- **In 2012 the Wellness Ctr. performed 5,300 low cost S/N surgeries for the public. With a ratio of 5 births to one surgery, this prevented 26,500 animals from being born and adding to the 3-4 million animals that face euthanization each year due to lack of shelter space and homes.**
- **The “Home Bound to the rescue” program brings our Vet team into housing facilities where we can provide vaccines for companion pets and provide nail clipping,**



**flea/tick treatments and assist low income owners with understanding medical issues the animals may be facing.**

- **Our “Pet Food Pantry” program reaches out to over 10 human food pantries in Central MA providing dog/cat food for those who cannot afford it, making sure that no one needs to forego their own food or medication to feed their beloved pets.**
- **Our “Relocation Program” reaches out Nationally to transport animals from parts of the country that are overwhelmed with huge populations and are forced to euthanize for space. The animals are brought via our own transport vehicles to our Adoption Ctr. to begin the process that will lead to their adoption. These transports do not take the place of local pets coming in to the shelter but fill kennels available when the local need is temporarily low.**
- **Our trained and certified staff partners with HSUS, ASPCA, and the Best Friends Animal Society to lend assistance to large scale National missions to take animals from horrendous situations like Dog Fighting, Puppy mills, Hoarding and abuse cases. Again helping to end animal suffering and abuse on a National level.**
- **We are very pleased to announce that our latest program is about ready to be rolled out later this summer. We have expanded our Wellness Center to include a new surgical suite and a large training and conference area. We will be offering low income families (proof of need will be required) a Vet Clinic called “The Healthy Community initiative. Our communities have suffered much during the recent downturn of economy, loss of jobs, loss of homes and income. We cannot allow their beloved companions to go without medical attention because they do not have the financial ability to provide it. More details on this new effort to keep our furry friends healthy and happy will announced over the upcoming week. This clinic is not in competition with local vets but for pet owners that would never see a regular veterinary clinic simply because they do not have the means to walk through their doors.**

The entire Second Chance family was pulling for Joe and we are thrilled to see him overcoming this setback. We were fortunate and blessed to have Dana Lavigne step up and offer to emcee our live auction this year. Dana, who as we came to learn, gained her skills as an Auctioneer at the same Kansas City school that Joe Craig had attended. Dana was a life-saver and hit a home run for us! The audience loved her style and energy and she made the auction come alive for everyone. We wish to extend our sincere thanks to Dana for so graciously giving of her time and talent to make this year's event another success. Due to the amazing popularity of this major fundraiser we are changing the venue for the 2014 event in order to be able to accommodate everyone who wants to be part of the fun. Please mark your calendars for the 15<sup>th</sup> Annual Dinner Auction. It will be held on March 22nd at the Leicester Country Club. We look forward to seeing you all again for even more fun with lots more room to enjoy the evening of fun to help our homeless pets.**

Update on Leo as of May 13th - the surgeon had to fuse the paw since he would never had normal movement in it. The leg has 9 pins to make it more "normal". So looks like the leg is saved and he will be able to use that leg for stability etc. He won't have full movement but we are very

happy that we didn't have to amputate the leg. Leo will now be able to be a more normal kitten! Thank you to everyone that donated for his care. It was an expensive surgeon for this little one, but to this little one, it means a new life :)
